- 629 cases linked among students, teachers and school staff due to transmissions

- Between 25-50% of Bergen County schools are in a virtual setting




COVID - 19 Activity Level Report

- Details: This addresses the needs to bring in youngest students every day. We are NOT considering this for grades 2-5 at this time.
- Cohort A-K will be AM, Cohort L-Z will be PM with the exception of affected bus students.
- Run extra buses and all bus students will be placed in the AM session (even if they have to switch cohorts). May impact student make-up of some cohorts, but all students will remain with the same teacher.
- Special Education services and schedules will be accommodated by this plan, and specific IEP needs will be addressed at the building level.
- At-home time will integrate a special and reinforcement activities; there will be no classroom teacher contact.
- Provide ample lead time before implementing any change.
- Survey will be sent to all K-1 families on this particular consideration.
