Federated Home and School Association Meeting Minutes October 8, 2020

Welcome: October Meeting

Kelly Buchsbaum welcomed everyone to the meeting at 9:17am via Zoom.

Board of Education Update:

Dr. Dan Fishbein, Superintendent

- ➤ Appreciate everyone's support with HOPE trees
 - Need update from PSEG regarding markouts
 - Kelly A (Hawes): Hawes has a lot of oaks in the playground, and child has been hit by acorns---request to have trees planted away from playground
 - Todd R (Orchard): Note: Northern red oaks grow to 60-70 ft, lots of branches and shade---kills grass around them
 - Alternative: Design a plaque to put on an existing tree
 - Dr. Fishbein: Each school will have a post next to the tree
 - Kelly B: Each school will have an opportunity to design a post; Dr. Fishbein and principals all supportive
 - Todd R.: Respectfully decline the offer for the tree
- ➤ Phase 2 update: Working with BOE to enhance offering
 - Concerns with eating lunch at school from parents and staff
 - Todd R: Since start date pushed back to Nov 9th, consider moving back later and extending day another half hour
 - For start times for middle and high school level--- suggest starting 45 min later for in-person
 - Dr. Fishbein: Discussed in the past; not many HS in other districts have moved start times---only Tenafly has moved start time but they do not have bussing
 - Moving it 45 min can impact bussing as well as other issues

- Mary M (RHS): Has been discussed at the HS for a long time; suggest raising issue with BOE; there was an extensive presentation last year; may not be the best time to start something new
- Kathy M: Parent committee represented by BOE and students; sleep-in days extended to twice a month last year
 - Consider for this year since no sleep-ins with the current schedule
 - Agree with Mary that it may not be a good time for changing start times this year since kids are not back at school full-time yet
- Ashley M (Ridge): Question regarding opening playgrounds for elementary schools
 - Dr. Fishbein: Protocols will be put in place and work with medical professionals
- ➤ Kelly B: There is a new company, Village Table, that is soliciting business from schools this could be a concern with existing contracts and/or other lunch providers who have asked to work with RPS in the past and not been able to due to Pomptonian. Please share info on Pomptonian contract Dr. Fishbein
 - Dr. Fishbein: cannot compete with contracted provider---gives a certain percentage back to the schools. Other suppliers cannot deliver to school---must be delivered to home then kids can bring to school
 - Kathy M: If 3rd party is delivering to home but benefiting HSA, it is ok to do as long as not being delivered to schools; web portal is organizing with local businesses
 - HSA presidents may need guidance regarding curbside pickup
 - Juliane C (GW): GW is working with Village Table as a fundraiser; parents can go to the restaurants to pick up for curbside; only participating in homes via deliveries and/or curbside restaurant pickup
 - Ashley M (Ridge): Also working with Village Table to do the same as GW; not for RFP

➤ Contact-tracing letters

- 3 different situations have occurred
- Contact tracing occurs immediately, and info disbursed quickly
- Fortunate to not have closures yet
- Nurse acts as conduit to village health officials; asks questions of teachers
- Teachers have been emphatic that kids have been wearing masks and socially distanced

• Elementary kids do not appear to be impacted by wearing masks

Mike Lembo, BOE

- Kelly B thanked Mike for acknowledging HSAs and Federated at last BOE meeting
 - Mike trying to get more parents involved
- > HOPE trees: Working with Dr. Fishbein regarding signs
- ➤ Delayed start time: was discussed with the last board; issue with sports---every district would have to move times
- ➤ Phase 2 reopening: Admin requested 2 extra weeks; Ridgewood has a low rate of positive tests; working towards full-day and will also keep remote option
 - Mary M (RHS): Recent schedule change well-received; parents and students want more time to get used to schedule change before proceeding
 - Would BOE consider having elementary kids have full days and MS and HS continue with current schedules?
 - Mr. Lembo: Has been brought up and agree that kids of different ages have different needs
 - Mr. Lembo invited to BF and Travell meetings
 - Kathy M: New BOE members may not know how schools operate on a day-to-day basis; may be beneficial for BOE members to attend school HSA meetings and hear from principals
 - Automatic default from parents---petitioning BOE seems to be an automatic response and bypassing schools and principals
 - BOE meetings must address this issue and reinforce system, and petitioning BOE should be last resort
 - Mike agrees that BOE meeting was drawn out due to BOE not knowing all the school issues; parents should talk to teachers first then principal then move up from that point; BOE cannot change anything at the school level
 - Social media: Mr. Lembo will encourage BOE members to post positive posts
 - Todd R: Issue that BOE airing issues on social media and stating opinions instead of going to the schools
 - Mike agrees that BOE members should go to HSA meetings
 - Mary: Agree with Kathy and Todd---needs more dialogue between parents/HSAs and BOE. Consider special public meeting with all HSA presidents and BOE or just have 2 BOE members at the HSA meetings if all are not permitted without having a special public meeting

- Kelly B: Will request dates of when HSAs would like to have one or two BOE members attend meetings
- Ashley M (Ridge): Should feedback be reported back from Google forms? Kelly B: Definitely---can do in the open discussion and then will funnel to Mr. Lembo and Dr. Fishbein
- Kathy: Special curriculum meetings occurred in the past that parents were part of; process changed to wellness speaker series
 - At BOE meetings, Gifted and Talented topics and mapping issues have been coming up; if issue is brought up to the BOE, then these should be directed to the teachers
 - Mr. Lembo: Curriculum committee exists---will check to see if there is parent involvement
- Kelly B: OPRA---what is it, what is the purpose, and how should it be used?
 - Mike: Open Public Records Act---ensure government officials or public officials are kept in check
 - Any member of public can request documents
 - Purpose: To keep things transparent and to see if officials are doing things properly
 - Cannot control who makes the requests
 - Cannot have private conversations with attorneys posted and other sensitive issues cannot be released
 - Unfortunate that a private citizen's email was exposed
 - Kelly B: Can a person request anonymously? Mike: Yes but need to have an email to send info
 - There have been OPRA requests for OPRA requests
 - Mary M: What is the cost to the district for an OPRA request? Mike: Cost of requests are low due to emails being sent (not hard copies) but still time-consuming; need to have specific info in the request (dates, topics, etc)

- Mr. Lembo: Cannot discourage people from using OPRA; appears requests are slowing down
- Web services now available to make it easier to obtain info
- ➤ Posted position for RPS Interim Superintendent; closing on the 16th with next meeting on the 19th
- ➤ Interviews with Business Administrator position and close to filling the position
- ➤ Kelly B: All HSAs have had first meetings; RHS has had more people at the meeting than ever before
 - HSAs should capitalize on this opportunity via online meetings to reach more parents
 - Would HSAs want Mike or a BOE member to attend their meetings?

President's Update:

Kelly Buchsbaum, President

- Vote for Northern Oak Commemorative tree: Each school will get one vote; send 1 vote per school and state name of school to Valerie by private chat or email. Vote to: (1) Have Federated contribute \$800 from Federated's Convocation Breakfast fund to defray cost of tree (note that Convocation Breakfast did not take place this year due to covid); (2) Have individual HSAs contribute \$302 each school to purchase tree for their school
 - Both votes (\$800 contribution from Federated and \$302 individual HSA contributions) were approved by 14 out of 15 members
- ➤ HSA presidents please remember that our Federated meeting updates should be shared at HSA meetings; if preferred, a Federated Executive Board member could attend a school's HSA meeting to provide updates upon request
- ➤ Fundraisers: Try not to book dates on other schools' fundraiser dates
 - For no-cook nights is it okay to promote all no-cook events via community social media and among other schools? Kelly B: It does not seem to take away from other schools and supports Village businesses and restaurants.
 - Christine and Jess (Travell) agree
 - Todd R: Just want to make sure they aren't overlapping dates; Christine thinks that school parents will see their school's fundraiser on enews and support their own school
 - Jess: Suggest using google doc to share
 - Christine: Shared google doc for all fundraisers/events
 - Kelly B: Have Colleen (VP secondary schools) and Amy (VP elementary) to send to those for respective schools to discuss
 - Colleen and Amy will send out Google doc

- Jimmy: Orchard has a google calendar that can be shared
- Kelly B: also please add your HSA meeting dates and times
- Elena: No school calendar started
 - Kelly: Elena can email her with dates and times or start a calendar
- o Somerville: Created signs to thank teachers as fundraiser
 - Kathy: REF had fundraiser through Printology; easy to do with Printology---just had to send in design
 - REF: Did not sell that many but may have more traction and sales at school levels
 - Francesca: Printology said it could be sold at other schools as well

Vice President's Report:

Colleen Tansey, 1st Vice President Amy Gill, 2nd Vice President

- ➤ Meet with secondary school presidents after this meeting
- ➤ Amy: Had meeting yesterday with elementary school presidents; exchange of many creative ideas

Treasurer's Report:

➤ Thanked all HSAs for submitting Federated dues

Member-at-Large Report:

Kathy Marshall, Member-at-Large

- > Directory update: Moving along; most staff and schools submitted data
 - GroupSpot will do upload this weekend
 - Meeting next Fri, 10/16, at 10am to discuss what directories look like with data loaded in; can invite ad chair if there is one; final 3 steps
 - Loading partner info ads
 - How to complete school info tab
 - How to allow access to subscribers to directory tab on app
 - On track to launch the week of Oct 19th
 - Report on dues collection requested: interested to compare to last year
 - Schools that sent in info seems to be comparable to last year
 - May be useful for Kelly B to also see ad sales; Kelly: new GroupSpot app allows businesses to update messages and HSAs to sell ads seasonally
 - Sarah (Somerville): Somerville did not receive Zoom meeting info for GroupSpot – Kathy will send
 - HSA presidents can also join other schools' news feeds for inspiration
 - Can amend directory

- Kelly A (Hawes): How can people have access to directory if phones are not updated enough for platform? Kathy: Will work on workaround after data is uploaded, possibly hard copies. May have web-based version later.
- Ashley (Ridge): ~50% have bought memberships. Can remaining families be targeted? Kathy: Yes. Also consider a special eblast along with customized emails to those who have not signed up
- Iuliane (GW): Customized blast works

➤ Insurance:

- New policy in place
- Issue with RHS Class of 2021 event that was piggybacked at Village event---possibly needed a rider but issue was resolved; request for advanced notice for these events to get a rider
- Reminder of insurance procedures if insurance is needed

➤ LSHSA update:

- Membership meeting on Fri, 10/2, attended also by Mike Lembo; Dr. Fenwick provided update; discussing having a meeting with just special ed parents at each school to discuss needs
- Janel Nese will speak with elementary schools, and Danielle Wood will speak with secondary schools
- Looking at more instruction for remote days
- Special ed rep, who is the LSHSA rep, is expected to be on every Pandemic Response Team at every school
- STEPSS 18-21 year old program launched during Dr. Fishbein's tenure and plans are proceeding for this program

> Paul McCarthy (Ridgewood Education Foundation)

- Outreach for fundraising; REF Oktoberfest cancelled this past spring; looking for fundraising methods; met with district yesterday and reviewed events
 - Discussed grant for abroad art program and raising funds to support
- Will meet next week to discuss fundraisers
- Thank you for donating space to promote REF in ad on GroupSpot
