#### **Board of Education Update:**

## Dr. Tom Gorman, Interim Superintendent

- ➤ Will be meeting with the Health department later today; 11 positive COVID cases confirmed earlier this week; another 4 will be reported out today; some parents displeased with going remote for first 2 weeks after break but it was the right decision based on the number of cases reported after break
- > First responders in town currently receiving vaccines
- > Protocol being developed to use shared school equipment safely
- > Superintendent search started this week with interviews beginning; possibly Feb for a decision
- ➤ Athletics start next Mon for HS sports; parents not allowed in gymnasium; everyone will be masked inside; possibility of livestreaming events from HS gyms
  - Kelly B: When will tryouts occur? Gorman: Tryouts for winter sports will be staggered. Spring sports starting later and ending later. Other extracurricular activities will also restart on Mon.
- ➤ Mary: Has new RPS Business Administrator started? Scott already started and will have him come to one of the Federated meetings.
- ➤ Events of last night in DC will be addressed district-wide in SS classes and will be age-appropriate; letter will be sent to the community

# Guest speakers: Lauren DePinto LCSW (RPS District Coordinator of Mental Health Services), Jeffrey Nyhuis (RHS Assistant Principal), Anne Robinson, Lynn Benson, Lori Weil, Jennifer Hamlet—Smart Balance/Later Start Time

- ➤ Smart Balance: Mr. Nyhuis has been working with parents to develop this program; developed advisory group of students---meet 2-3 times per month to discuss issues at RHS and to promote healthy balance in the lives of students
  - Outcomes: Schoolwork-free break; blackout week in summer; enrichment mornings ("sleep-ins"); extended period 9 from 18 to 25 min; removed decile ranking off the transcripts; worked on homework status with staff
  - O Presented Healthy Clock slide: Important for school to provide 9 hours of sleep to students as recommended by CDC and AAP; sleep from 11pm-8am and having school start at 8:30-3:30. For activities, sports practices should be no more than 2 hours---have been discussing with Athletic Director Keith Cook. Family (dinner) time from 7-8pm. Homework should also be no more than 2 hours per night---kids should not be overscheduled. Downtime between 10-11pm.
    - Schedule has been changed 3 times since September. Need to have a plan for when things return to normal, hopefully next fall.
    - Delaying start of school from 25-60 min corresponds to additional time sleeping---students will use the time to sleep if given the time.
    - Anne Robinson in discussion with BOE members to create a committee to discuss later start time.
    - Mary Micale: Many students made the decision to return to school all remote in order to have longer time to sleep
    - Anne R: Students are benefitting from later school start times from all aspects
    - Kathy Marshall: College practice times are much shorter than HS practice times; more attuned to students' well-being; Ridgewood should set the tone for other schools in the county; should not use athletics and sports as an excuse to make a change to improve the well-being of students
    - Lauren D: From mental health perspective, need to look at prevention. When return to "normal" we need to focus on balance and well-being.

#### **Special Guest: Lauren DePinto**

➤ Video Project: School-based mental health team is developing Mental Health and Wellness Speaker video series for all school levels (Elementary; Middle; High School) with panel discussions; based on 4 habits of learning and how it pertains to mental health

- Already completed for RHS; videos being developed for other schools at grade-appropriate levels
- Kelly B: Will there be a video developed for parents of children with special needs? Lauren: Will eventually be developed.
- Kelly B: Have questions already been formulated for elementary schools? Lauren: Want parent voice to develop the questions. Jeff N agreed that parent perspective is important.
- Now have school-based mental health website
- Elena (RED): Difficult for PreK to have any educational instruction virtually due to difficulty with using chrome books at that age; currently doing a lot of crafts online
- Marguarite C (LSHSA): Many parents would like to know how to handle increased arguing/fighting among kids--possible topic for video; Lauren made a note to address this issue
- Mary M: Sibling rivalry is a constant issue---may be relevant for all ages
- Kelly B: (Posing question from Todd R) What are ways to support families who have had a loss during this time? What are ways to support teachers? Lauren: Teacher wellness is extremely important. Trauma-informed care (using effective language to approach behavior---"what happened" instead of "why did you do that") has been used at different departments to educate the staff.
- Kelly B: Requested HSA presidents to ask executive boards and other parents for questions to send to Lauren for videos.

#### Mike Lembo, BOE

- ➤ BOE will be meeting with Smart Balance to discuss later school start times
- ➤ Superintendent search: interviews started yesterday; over 2200 responses from survey sent to parents; R-PAT also visited other groups (REA, teachers, etc)
  - o 20 applicants (15 males); from different states and with varying backgrounds
- Continuing to work with Health department
- ➤ BOE meeting agenda for Mon---audit will be discussed; will be a short meeting

## President's Update:

- ➤ Encouraged everyone to support RHS Jamboree
  - Iamboree funds raised will be donated to scholarships for seniors
  - Journal this year will be digital with links
