Superintendent's Update:

Dr. Tom Gorman, Interim Superintendent

- > Snow day with 1 virtual day worked out well. Unsure if state will allow a virtual day to count as a snow day in the future.
- ➤ BOE meeting on Monday will be summarizing COVID impact
- > Stacie Polestra reporting on DEI at BOE meeting
- ➤ Late start time will also be discussed at BOE meeting
- ➤ Christine M (Travell): Is there a plan to vaccinate teachers? Dr. Gorman: Depends on the state and supplies. Ridgewood Health dept was receiving vaccines but not receiving any more.
- ➤ Kathy: If teachers are vaccinated, will they be teaching in school again? Dr. Gorman: When school opens in September, and if governor does not allow teachers to teach from home, then teachers will have to teach in school. Also kids will not be vaccinated by summer.
- ➤ Ashley M (Ridge): Will Ridgewood schools start following rules of CDC after traveling (ie 7 days with negative test as per CDC instead of 14 days?) Dr. Gorman: We have to follow NJ guidelines which is 14 days.

Board of Education Update:

Mike Lembo, BOE

- ➤ COVID vaccine: BOE and Dr. Gorman doing everything possible to get kids back in school. If possible, everyone should get vaccinated when able to in order to achieve herd immunity
- ➤ Late start time: 2 BOE members to view the Smart Balance presentation; other 3 BOE members have seen the presentation
- ➤ Internet policy: Revision of use of internet being reviewed
- > DEI: Meeting tomorrow and presentation will be on Monday's BOE meeting
- ➤ All BOE meetings recorded and on website
- ➤ Budget: All Board members will be meeting with Business Administrator and giving presentations in the spring at schools
- ➤ AlphaBest running before and after care for K-5 and will be expanding services to holidays

Guest speakers: Sheila Brogan (Super Science Saturday and Municipal Alliance)

- ➤ **Super Science Saturday** entering 33rd year this year. Will not be canceled but will be entirely virtual on March 6th. Livestream program starting at 10am with visit to 0maha Zoo. Ridgewood HS Invent team will do a 15 min presentation on award-winning project---won \$10K grant from MIT. Virtual visit to Bergen County Zoo and Van Saun Park. Will end with virtual rocket launch. Adult presenters will do selfie videos that will be posted to website for 1 month. On March 6, go to SuperScienceSaturday.org and click on livestream. Students can do selfie videos and send in. Funded by REF and Zenocide.
- ➢ Ridgewood Municipal Alliance: funded by NJ Alliance on alcohol and drug abuse program. Established by municipalities. Focused on alcohol and drug use prevention for anyone. Responsible for submitting grant to state for programs. Funding through fines paid from penalties for alcohol and drug abuse ie drunk driving, etc. Ridgewood has been recognized for work. Supported by RPS, esp middle and high schools and crisis counselors are on the committee. Mary Micale and Kelly B serve on the committee. Data tracked from hospitals and schools. Reported incidences are low in Ridgewood. Funds used for training for prevention at HS and middle schools. Funded the program, "Parents who host lose the most." Sponsor safe homes pledge and network. Grant decreased to \$3500 this year due to deficit funds of \$10K. Tim Shoemaker developed videos for middle schools about vaping. Cost would be \$2500 to use in the 2 schools—proposed to middle school prinicipals.

- > Additional programs offered to students outside of school
 - Young Musicians program for elementary and middle school students: fundraiser for Summer Music Program

- Dance event for elementary school students run by former dance teacher at RHS
