December minutes approved.

Superintendent's Update:

Dr. Tom Gorman, Superintendent

- Many new COVID cases over break but teacher absences are trending down; COVID cases also down---peak was yesterday; RHS has 4 more teachers back; attendance rate going up
 - Possible delayed opening tomorrow due to approaching storm
- CDC and NJDOH regarding quarantine: New 5 day quarantine not recommended for schools
 - Trend does not indicate that we need to pivot to virtual
- COVID testing clinic on Wed tested 300 people and same number tested over break; majority who were tested were kids
- Vaccination rates in RPS: HS 98%; MS 60-70%; 5-11yo 30%; will send out another survey for updated numbers
- Todd: Booster clinic was scheduled during school hours--possibility to have one outside school hours? Dr. Gorman: Will discuss with Ridgewood DOH regarding making hours more available to students
- Wizards: Good decision to moving date; principals are moving dates of events by a few weeks instead of canceling
- Chicago shut down schools due to teachers wanting virtual option but in-person learning is the best for kids

- BOE meeting agenda next week will include swearing-in of new board members; election for new president and vice-president
- Jess: Alternate schedule FAQ questions are being collected---when should the questions be sent in? Gorman: Committee meets on 1/24/2022 so having questions will be helpful for that meeting. The Record has been reporting on discussion that occurred at BF and asking for more info since the meeting but no new info at this time.

- Green Ridgewood meets monthly the first Thurs of each month; January meeting will be via Zoom at 7pm
- Green Ridgewood is vetted by Village Council, and ideas from Green Ridgewood are forwarded to the Council
 - Looking for another member if anyone is interested
- Ridgewood Green Team: subcommittee of Green Ridgewood; maintains Ridgewood's participation in Sustainable Jersey and maintains Silver status (recognized on Dec 12, 2017); re-evaluation this year regarding status and meeting eligibility for status
- Planning Board to update the Master Plan---has not been updated since the 1970s
- Earth Day 2022 will be held on Sun, April 10th at Van Neste Square from 10am-4pm. The purpose is to educate town about sustainable choices residents can make in the community and may possibly include the following:

 - Sponsor organizations: Green Ridgewood, Parks and Rec, Water Dept
 - Would like to have 1 booth from each school to showoff photos, videos, posters, demonstrations
 - Stable interested in hosting an art show if there is interest
 - Refer to slide deck for links
- Jess: Should school's Green Team contact Beth to organize booth? Beth: Yes, have Green Team from schools reach out directly to me.
- Kelly: Consider creating a group on GroupSpot to communicate to schools
- The town will be starting Styrofoam collection at the recycling center

- Angela: Participated in food waste pilot program---will it be continued? Beth: Will follow up with Village Council member who ran the program to see if there is enough interest
- Tasneem: At GW, a Green Team club has formed and has initiated many projects at the school
