February minutes approved.

Superintendent's Update:

Dr. Tom Gorman, Superintendent

- Mask guidelines have changed 3 times since announcement made by state; will put out guidance when final guidelines released
 - Will continue contact tracing on Mon 3/7/2022 after mask mandate is lifted; must be boosted in order to avoid quarantine if over age 12
 - All mask guidelines subject to change based on changes in COVID-19 rates
 - Currently at low risk level (green zone) with high vaccination rate in schools
 - Cleaning procedures will continue to remain in place
 - No vaccine mandates currently

Board of Education Update:

Mike Lembo, BOE

- May reorganize the committees and structure of the committees; also trying to get more community and school involvement
- Audit will be presented at this Mon's meeting

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- Prelim budget to be presented at special meeting on 3/14 with plan to adopt budget on 3/24
- On 3/8/22, state of state address to discuss school aid—missing from district budget at this time
 - Budget will not go to a vote on unless it is over 2% which is not planned for this year
 - No additional budget presentations at schools this year due to timing of release of state budget
 - Can watch recorded meeting if unable to attend
- Mask policy may be discussed at state of state address but will need to wait for official documents are released
 - Mask optional starting Mon
- Kelly: Will alternative start times be discussed? Dr. Gorman: Will be discussed on next meeting; this meeting was a training meeting.
 - Kelly: Was it not brought up because bus contracts already in place? Dr. Gorman: No.

Guest Speaker: Kevin Feeley (Mental health clinician for RPS) District Anti-Vaping Efforts, including Tim Shoemaker Assemblies

- Tim Shoemaker (law enforcement officer, motivational speaker) will be coming in May (either 24th or 25th)
- Cost being partially funded by Municipal Alliance via grant received for that purpose (\$1900)
- \bullet Requesting additional funds from Federated (~\$600) to fully cover cost of presentation
- Vaping may be declining but may be used for marijuana which is concerning
- Jess: Will the presentation be live-streamed and in person? Kevin: Will plan to have in-person if possible and will also be live-streamed.
- Mary: contract states one day to speak to MS students and virtual parent presentation. Will older elementary kids be able to watch a pre-recorded version? Kevin: will discuss with Tim.

Guest Speaker: Beth Creller, Mike Faherty Earth Day Update/Ridgewood Project 1000 Acres

- Gas blowers, mowers, fertilizers not good for environment
- Website sponsored by Green Ridgewood
- Program built around 10 actions: Align with town, EPA, Rutgers
 - All voluntary actions:
 - Commit, convert, plant a tree, remove invasives, no gas mowing, no gas blowing, reduce toxicity, fertilize organic, compost leaves
 - All have resources on how to implement actions
- Examples around town of the actions being implemented: Children's sensory and butterfly garden (behind The Stable)
- 1000 acres: Goal to manage 1/3 of Ridgewood's town land more sustainably
- Will be launched at Earth Day

- School properties can be used to implement actions
- Mary: League of Women Voters planning on banning gas blowers. Is this part of town's 20 year Master plan? Beth: Yes.
- Jess: How does this affect the school district's landscaping contracts due to higher cost to maintain a garden vs a lawn? Mike: will need support from parents and schools; would start small with a garden at the schools; can involve Green Teams at the schools
- Tasneem: If space and volunteers available at schools, would members of 1000 acres team be able to provide education and/or funds? Beth: Unable to provide funds but schools may want to consider fundraising
 - Green Team has club meetings every other week—would like to have speaker discuss 1000 acres initiative
 - Mike already involved in clubs at RHS; would like more contact with MS and elementary schools—-Mary will pass on info
- Mike: Requesting contact teachers for Green Teams at schools to coordinate planning. Mary will collect contact info and forward to Mike.
- Christine: Somerville also coordinating Green Team and applying for grant
 - Green Fair on 4/21—Ridgewood recycling team paying for speaker and having school-wide planting
- Kelly: Suggest having 1000 Acres speak at HSA meetings
- Beth: Start small with projects
 - Earth Day will be celebrated on April 10th in town; can highlight what schools are doing and would like to have all schools participate; Project 1000 acres, electric vehicles, and school projects will be the 3 things that will be highlighted
 - Green Team Meetings currently on Zoom; next one is tonight
 - Casual informal meeting at Bulldog at 11am
 - Mary: Suggest having an HSA rep at meetings. Beth: need someone from BF
 - Forms to be submitted by 3/25 if possible but will make room for schools at event even if submitted after the deadline

- Citizen Safety Advisory Committee: need volunteer to help with parking map for Village—-reach out to Mary
 - Age-friendly Ridgewood: pedestrian concerned about kids riding bikes in town on sidewalks (which is illegal) and dangerous for pedestrians
 - Suggestions made to make Ridgewood Ave a one way street or close completely to make pedestrian walkway

 - Kevin Feeley request for \$600 for anti-vaping
 - All voted yes; none opposed
